Be it Remembered, That at a **DISTRICT COURT** of the  
**UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, held in and for the Southern District of New York,  
on Thursday the — 28<sup>th</sup> — day of May, in the year of  
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, Andrew Carnegie, at present of the City  
of New York — came into Court and applied to the said Court to be admitted to become a  
Citizen of the United States of America, pursuant to the directions of the Act of the Congress of the United  
States of America, entitled "An Act to establish an uniform rule of Naturalization and to repeal the Acts here-  
before passed on that subject" passed 14th of April, 1803, and to the directions of the Acts of the said Congress  
subsequently passed on that subject. And the said Andrew Carnegie having thereupon produced  
to the Court such evidence, and made such declaration and renunciation as are, by said acts, required. Thereupon,  
it was considered by the said Court, that the said Andrew Carnegie be admitted, and he was accordingly  
admitted by the said Court to be a **CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**.
